

Learn about using distance learning at the library to prepare for your GED

Come learn about how to join over 10,000 students in Illinois and other states who have prepared to take their GED exam by studying online with GED-i, an online preparation course. GED-i is a learning opportunity using both teachers and computers. A student will work independently with the full support and guidance of a GED teacher.
